Elimination of Loss of Credit Practice based on Attendance

The Board of Education discussed the recommendation of the Loss of Credit Project Team, a group representing teachers, administrators, central services staff, parents and students. The project team was charged with reviewing the circumstances under which credit for a class would be lost. After a thorough review of student achievement and attendance data, attendance policies of neighboring jurisdictions, and other information, the team recommended that the practice of denying credit for classes based on attendance be eliminated starting with the 2010–2011 school year. That recommendation has been accepted.

Unlawful absences will be considered disciplinary infractions. Furthermore, students will be expected to make up missed work regardless of the legal status of their absence, in accordance with Regulation IKA-RA, Grading and Reporting. A team has been convened to coordinate implementation and communication of the project team recommendation. "I am extremely pleased that the loss of credit practice will be removed from our schools," said Student Member of the Board Timothy Hwang. "This will allow our focus to return to the importance of students attending school and address the causes for lack of attendance, rather than the bureaucratic paper documentation for loss of credit."

Placement, Promotion, Acceleration, and Retention

- Intervention for Student Course Promotion Policy

As of July 1st, when a student in grades 9-12 is not attaining the course objectives, they will not be able to be promoted ahead until the course objectives are met. If these strategies are not successful, the Educational Management Team will modify the plan. Parents/guardians and students will be included in the process.
